**SELECTION CALL FOR ADMISSION TO THE PhD PROGRAMME in
GLOBAL STUDIES. ECONOMY, SOCIETY AND LAW - XXXV CYCLE
- ACADEMIC YEAR 2019-2020 -**

Art. 1 - Opening of the PhD Programme in Global Studies. Economy, Society and Law.

The University of Urbino Carlo Bo opens a public competitive selection for the PhD course in Global Studies. Economy, Society and Law, cycle XXXV, Academic Year 2019-2020.

At the end of the present call a table specifies the Department's administrative headquarter, the duration of the programme, the total number of places available, the number of scholarships available with the related funding body, the admission tests methods, the exam calendar and the place where the exams will be held.

The official call for admission is published at the University of Urbino's official register (www.uniurb.it/alboufficiale) and is also available at the website address <http://www.uniurb.it/global-studies>

Public notice of this call for application is also given in English on the University's website, on the European website Euraxess and on the website of the Ministry of Education, University and Research.

The PhD course will commence on 1st November 2019 and lasts three years (until 31st October 2022).

Art. 2 - Admission requirements

Applications for admission to the PhD Programme as per the previous point are invited, without any discrimination by gender, age and citizenship, from applicants in possession of one of the following degrees:

- a) An Italian University Degree awarded prior to the reform;
- b) An Italian Laurea Magistrale (Master degree) (ex M.D. 509/99 or M.D. 270/04)
- c) Any other degree equalized to the ones mentioned above or higher academic titles released by tertiary education institutions belonging to the AFAM system (High Training in Arts)
- d) Non-Italian degrees equivalent to the required academic qualification (Master's degree)¹ released by an officially recognized tertiary education. The eligibility of the degree will be assessed by the Selection Board. Such degree must be comparable to an Italian Master degree (*Laurea Magistrale*) as for duration, level, subjects and must be valid to enrol in a similar PhD course in the country where it has been released.

The selection is also open to candidates who will be awarded their degree (as mentioned in the list above under a., b., c. and d.) by **October 31st 2019**. In this case, admission to the Programme is "conditional" on the achievement of the qualification. Candidates selected for admission to the Programme will have to send a proper self-certification or documentation proving the qualification to the PhD and Higher Education Department (by email to the following address: dottorato@uniurb.it) otherwise the position offer will be cancelled.

All applicants are admitted to the selection procedure subject to confirmation. The Administration may, at any time for justified reasons, order the exclusion due to a lack of requirements.

Applicants are not allowed to the selection procedure if enrolled in any other PhD course.

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Art. 3 – Application procedure and deadline

Application for the selection procedure must be filled in **online** according to the following procedure.

1. **Online Registration** - Access to the admission procedure is subject to registration, following the instructions available at: <http://www.uniurb.it/studentionline>. **Deadline: 10th June 2019, 12:00 (CEST).**

A. Candidates who have never registered with the University's website:

Registration - Select "REGISTRAZIONE" from the menu and fill in the required personal data. The system will generate credentials to be used after selecting LOGIN. After logging in, the candidate can access the restricted area: "TEST DI AMMISSIONE" and select the chosen PhD programme.

B. Candidates already registered with the University of Urbino

(registered, enrolled, pre-enrolled in a university course, even if only for competition procedures, graduates etc.)

Restricted area – Login – select "LOGIN" directly by entering your credentials (username and password received at last registration).

Should the candidate no longer possess the credentials he/she can retrieve them by logging on to <http://www.uniurb.it/studentionline> by selecting the "PASSWORD DIMENTICATA (FORGOT PASSWORD)" link and following the instructions.

After having logged in, the candidate must click on the course of study of the last registration in order to display the entry: "TEST DI AMMISSIONE (ADMISSION TEST)" and choose the PhD programme in Global Studies, Economy, Society and Law.

2. Filling in the application form

The application form must be filled in in all its fields, attaching the documents (with the "upload" function) required for the admission and evaluation (see point 4 below and the Annex A).
The application can be saved and modified until final confirmation.

3. Admission fee.

Applicants are required to pay the **non-refundable admission fee of 30,00 Euros**.

At the end of the "filling in" of the application procedure, click on "Area Studente" (Student's Area). By clicking on "Numero di Fattura" under the "Pagamenti" (Payments) section the different payment methods will appear:

For payments made within the Italian territory:

The application and its annexes must be filled in and submitted exclusively via the online procedure no later than 12.00 (Italian time) on 10th June 2019 (applications submitted after the deadline will not be considered).

Applicants are requested to fill in the application form and to pay the fee for admission to the selection procedure well ahead of time, to avoid connectivity problems.

Documents can be added prior to the final deadline only.

Candidates are responsible for the correct conclusion of the procedure. Applications within the deadlines which are incomplete and/or in the absence of due payment will not be considered valid nor processed. Any applications submitted in any different way other than the one described above, will not be taken into consideration.

Disabled candidates or candidates with specific learning differences may, compliant with Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992, and subsequent amendments and integrations, and Law no. 170 of 8 October 2010, obtain extensions or help for admissions tests.

As well as making specific requests in the admissions application, it is necessary to provide medical certification for the validity of the request. This certification must be sent to the PhD and Higher Education Department before the closure of the applications process.

4. Compulsory annexes to the application form

Besides documents listed in the Annex A, applicants must attach the following documents as PDF files:

- 1) Identity document:** a scan of the ID card (for EU citizens) or the passport (for non-EU candidates), specifically the pages with photograph, ID details, number, place and date of issue, expiry and signature;

Candidates with Italian qualifications:

Qualification achieved: self-certification, pursuant to art. 46 of Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28.12.2000, and subsequent amendments, with examinations passed, credits and marks (facsimile available on the page <https://www.uniurb.it/studiacoноoi/laureati/dottorati-di-ricerca/informazioni-perammissione>);

Pending qualification: self-certification, compliant with art. 46 of Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28.12.2000 and subsequent amendments, with examinations passed, credits and marks, plus the presumed date for the degree examination, set out using the annexed facsimile.

Candidates with foreign qualifications:

Qualification achieved: copy of the academic diploma held and required for access to the PhD course, accompanied by a list of examinations passed, together with the relevant credits and marks and if available, by a Diploma Supplement² / Transcript of Records³ / Declaration of value or Rectoral Decree of equivalence. The Declaration of Value can be replaced by a certificate issued by ENIC-NARIC⁴

² The Diploma Supplement is understood as being a document annexed to a higher education diploma for the purposes of increased international "transparency" and to make it easier for qualifications to be recognised academically and professionally (diplomas, degrees, certificates, etc.). 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centres, containing all of the information necessary to assess the qualification. Submission of official documentation is compulsory for the enrolment.

Pending qualification:

- certification of registration, together with a list of examinations taken and relevant credits and marks,
- statement that the qualification will be achieved by 31 October 2019, specifying the institution and official duration of the course of study.

Original certificates or copies are accepted in Italian, English, French and Spanish. All other languages will require a translation into Italian, or English, signed by the candidate.

3) Teleconference interview – form (to be submitted in case the applicant cannot present himself/herself to the interview in Urbino).

An interview/oral examination is part of the selection procedure (see article 4 and annex A to this Call), All applicants admitted to this part of the procedure will have to either be present at Urbino University at the date indicated in Annex A (recommended option) or submit a request for a teleconference interview. In case the applicant cannot present himself/herself to the interview (oral exam), he/she can file a request to be interviewed via teleconference, filling in a form (facsimile available here:

<https://www.uniurb.it/studiaconnoi/laureati/dottorati-di-ricerca/informazioni-perammissione> to be submitted jointly with the application. The teleconference interview must follow the procedures described in the ensuing article 4, and in Annex A.

4) Other titles and documentation as indicated in Annex A.

Art. 4 - Selection procedure

The examination consists in qualification assessment and oral exam (interview).

The admission exams may score a total of 80 points. A maximum of 20 points is awarded to the assessment of the CV, the research project, academic qualifications and other titles and documents as stated in Annex A. A maximum of 60 points is awarded to the interview.

The assessment of qualifications is made by the Selection Board before the oral exam (interview).

For the PhD course in Global Studies, the admission to the oral exam (interview) is reserved to candidates with a minimum score of 14 points awarded to the qualification assessment (CV, academic qualifications, research project, letters of reference).

The final score will result from the sum of points awarded to the qualifications assessment and to the oral interview.

The outcome of the qualification assessment process will be published, prior to the oral interview, on the university website, at the link www.uniurb.it/global-studies

To be considered eligible, a candidate must get no less than 40 points in the final score.

The oral exam (interview) will be held at the University of Urbino, according to the procedure described below and to the venue, date and timetable included in the Annex A.

The annexed timetable of the oral exam must be considered an official convocation valid for all legal purposes. No other communication will be sent to individual candidates.

Any change in the date, timetable or location of the exams will be published on the university website, at the page: www.uniurb.it/global-studies

To take part to the interview, candidates must present themselves in the place and time reported in the Annex A, exhibiting a valid identity document.

Failure to attend the admission examination is considered an explicit withdrawal of application.

The oral examination also includes a test of English language skills.

Admission exams are carried out to guarantee suitable comparative assessment of candidates.

In case the applicant requested a teleconference interview (using the form referenced in art. 3) in their application procedure, an online interview will take place. In his/her request, the candidate must provide a personal contact/address and make sure to have access to a webcam, necessary to be identified by the Selection Board. To take part to the oral exam, the candidate must access the web address received via e-



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mail by the Selection Board, and exhibit the same Identity Document annexed to the application form. Candidates not complying with these rules will be excluded. The Selection Board may define a specific timetable for interviews.

Art. 5 - Selection Board

The members of the Selection Board will be appointed in compliance with current regulations and with the provisions of the PhD Regulations of the University of Urbino Carlo Bo.

At the end of the oral exam, the Selection Board will issue a list of the candidates examined together with the scores from the interview. The list, signed by the Chairperson and the Secretary of the Board, will be published in the webpage www.uniurb.it/global-studies

The minutes of the selection procedures will be sent by the Chairperson of the Board to the Rector for final approval.

Art. 6 - Ranking, Admission and PhD Enrolment Procedures

The Rector will approve the merit ranking with a Decree, listing the successful candidates according to their rank position.

In the merit ranking, in case two or more candidates have the same score, the higher ranking will be given to those with a worse economic condition (for positions with scholarship) or younger (for positions without scholarship).

No private communication will be sent: the publication of the merit ranking shall constitute the sole and official means of information to the interested parties.

The decree with the final ranking will be published in the Official Register of the University (www.uniurb.it/alboufficiale) and in the webpage www.uniurb.it/global-studies

The winning candidates are admitted to the PhD courses according to the ranking position and in a number equal to the number of places available.

Successful applicants must enrol within the term indicated in the Rector's Decree reporting the merit ranking, under penalty of forfeiture.

The enrolment of successful applicants that have still to obtain their qualification will be made contingent upon actual earning of their degree. Those not earning the necessary qualification will lose their position. The earned qualification must be communicated to the PhD and Higher Education Department within the term included in the above-mentioned Rector's Decree.

Successful candidates with foreign qualifications must deliver a Declaration of Value, together with certification of the qualification with examinations, credits and marks, translated and legalised by the competent Italian diplomatic authorities in the country of issue. Failure to provide these documents will lead to disqualification from the PhD programme. The Declaration of Value can be replaced by a certificate issued by ENIC-NARIC⁴ centres, containing all of the information necessary to assess the qualification.

According to the classification, other candidates from the list will be admitted to the PhD Programme in the event of disqualification or renunciation within two months from the start of same.

If the person renouncing their place also benefits from a study scholarship, they will not be required to return the monthly payments already received. The University will reallocate the remainder of the scholarship to another candidate on the course without a scholarship and according to the admission classification. Successful non-EU candidates residing outside Italy, after registering and paying the required fee, shall provide a copy of their residence permit/foreigner's permit of stay, or a copy of their application for same to the competent Authorities.

Art. 7 - Scholarships

Scholarships are awarded according to the ranking defined in the list drawn up by the Selection Boards, for an amount equal to that determined in accordance with M.D. 40 dated 25 January 2018.

The scholarship amounts to € 15.343,28 gross / year — subject to National Social Insurance (INPS) in compliance with current regulations. Scholarship taxation for PhD courses is regulated by article 4 of Law number 476 dated 13th August, 1984.



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Should two or more candidates be ranked with equal merit, the candidate with the worse economic situation shall prevail or younger. In the event of a further equal result, the younger candidate shall prevail.

Students that received a PhD scholarship, even for a limited amount of time, cannot benefit from a new one.

The award of a study scholarship will apply for the duration of the PhD course.

The scholarship starts at the beginning of the PhD programme and instalments are paid monthly.

Scholarships are confirmed only in case of admission to the following course year, according to the decision of the Teaching Body.

The amount of the scholarship will be increased by 50% for any period of time spent abroad. Periods abroad may not exceed a total of eighteen months.

Starting from the second year, each doctoral candidate is endowed, within the financial resources allocated in the balance sheet as per current laws, a *budget* for research in Italy and abroad according to the PhD programme, which will not be lower than 10% of the amount of the scholarship.

Any civil servant admitted to the PhD Courses is placed, upon application and compatibly with his/her administration's needs, on special leave for study reasons for the duration of the course, and where the required conditions are met, he/she may benefit from the scholarship. In the event of admission to a PhD course without a scholarship, or of waiving this, the party concerned, while on leave, keeps his/her salary, pension and retirement contributions from the public institution with which he/she has an employment relationship in place.

Art. 8 – Enrolment Fees

PhD students must pay an enrolment fee of € 156.00 (inclusive of stamp duty and regional tax).

First-year students must pay the fee when enrolling; fees for subsequent years must be paid by November 30th each year.

In case of delayed payments, a default indemnity of 40 Euro will be applied.

Payments must be made using the payment methods detailed in art. 3, point 3.

Art. 9 – University Benefits (Regional Body for student financial aid)

In accordance with Legislative Decree no. 68 dated 29th March, 2012, PhD students may use the benefits made available by the Regional Body for Student Financial Aid makes available to all students, at the same conditions. Candidates can apply for services (Scholarship, Halls of Residence lodging, University canteen benefits, etc.) by submitting their application form according to the Call for Applications published at: www.ersurb.it - www.erdis.it, where the admission terms and conditions are published.

Art. 10 - Reference regulations

All matters not included in the present call will be governed by regulations and legislation concerning PhD programmes.
